Introduction:

- A. Companionship is one of our basic human needs.
 - 1. We want to share in things with others.
 - 2. Peer presure is a strong influence.
- B. The greatest companionship is that of God's people.
 - We have in common more than any other group of people.
 - John refers to himself as a companion of those not on the island of Patmos.

I. FOUR AREAS OF COMPANIONSHIP. V9

- A. "I, John, also am your brother."
 - 1. They were brothers in Christ.
 - 2. Were born again, thus they had the very same Father.
 - The strongest brotherhood. (Union)
- B. "and companion in tribulation."
 - 1. companion = sugkoinonos a joint-partaker.
 - 2. tribulation = thlipsis a pressure from evils.
 - 3. John was on Patmos, a Fenal Island.
- C. "and in the Kingdom."
 - The kingdom is ours because God has promised it to us.
 - 2. "Thy Kingdom Come."
 - 3. Eph. 1:11-14.
- D. "and patience of Jesus Christ."
 - patience = hupomone a remaining under, a bearing up under.
 - These were companions of one another and Jesus Christ in bearing the load.
 - 3. Not in social functions.

II. THE CRIME OF JOHN THE REVELATOR.

[Or the creation of the companionship.]

- A. "for the Word of God."
 - John suffered because he taught all of the Word of God.
 - 2. We are companions in the Word of God!
 - 3. We are LANDMARKERS.
 - a. Local church.
 - b. Closed Communion.
 - Scriptural baptism consists of candidate, mode, authority.
 - d. Re-baptizers.
 - e. Church discipline.
- B. "and for the testimony of Jesus Christ."
 - testimony = marturia a bearing witness, certifying, a testimony that informs as well as corroborates.
 - John testified truthfully about the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - 3. A testimony should contain tree things, Willingness to testify, telling the Truth, and a Life to make it believable.
