GODLY LOVE, JOHN'S CAUTION I John 4:7-11

Introduction:

- A. John has warned the fellowship of false spirits.
 - "believe not every spirit."
 - 2. "try the spirits."
- B. In such circumstances, there would be much room for abuse.
 - 1. The flesh never allows for the judging of itself.
 - 2. Accusations could fly and hate emerge.
- C. John immediately issues another command.
 - 1. "Beloved, love one another."
 - Love, godly love, would be the best defense against the flesh.

I. THE SOURCE OF GODLY LOVE VS. 7,8

- A. God is the source of love.
 - 1. "for love is of God."
 - 2. If it is love, it is of God.
- B. When man loves, he reflects God's love.
 - "and everyone that loveth is born of God and Knoweth God."
 - 2. Lost men may love, but only saved have Godly love.
- C. If men do not love they know not God.
 - 1. vs. 8 "He that loveth not, knoweth not God."
 - 2. "God is love."

II. THE PROOF OF GODLY LOVE VS. 9

- A. "In this was manifested the love of God toward us."
 - manifested = to make apparent, to make openly known.

- B. "God sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him."
 - 1. "God sent."
 - 2. "that we might live."

III. THE POWER OF GODLY LOVE. VS.10

- A. God loved us in our sins.
 - "Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us."
- B. God's love provided a remedy.
 - "and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sin
 - propitiation = expiation, payment, satisfaction, as in a sacrifice.

IV. THE OBLIGATION OF THOSE CALLED THE CHILDREN OF GOD. VS. 11

- A. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another."
 - 1. How much did God love us?
 - 2 ought = to owe, to be indebted, to be bound, to be obligated.
- B. Love, the universal sign of discipleship.
 - 1. John 13:34,35
 - 2. Parable of the two debtors.
