# THE CHURCH IN LAODICEA REV. 3:14-22

# Introduction:

- A. "And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write."
  - Angel = messenger = pastor.
  - 2. Laodiceans = democracy.
- B. The city of Laodicea was known for three principle things.
  - City of Wealth. Banking, very stable, once when destroyed by an earthquake, refused help.
  - 2. Fine Clothing. Wool from black sheep.
  - Medicine. Particularly eye-salve.
- C. "These things saith Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God."
  - Amen = amen to be trustworthy.
  - 2. faithful = pistos one on whom we may rely.
  - 3. true = alethinos = that which has truth for its base, genuine, real, as opposed to that which is fictitious.
  - 4. The one who began God's creation. John 1:
- I. THE CONDITION OF THE CHURCH. V15
  - A. "I know thy works."
    - know = oida to know by observation.
    - works = erga that produced by labor.
  - B. "that thou art neither cold nor hot."
    - cold = psuchros cold, chill, cool, fresh.
    - 2. hot = zestos zest, boiling, boiled. hot.
  - C. "I would thou wert cold or hot."
    - 1. would = ophelon wish about the present tense.

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- 2. "It is my wish that now you were hot or cold."
- 3. Hot or cold acceptable to God.

## II. THE CONSEQUENCES OF LUKEWARMNESS. V16

- A. "So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither hot or cold."
  - 1. lukewarm = klaros warm, lukewarm.
  - 2. A tepid liquid.
- B. "because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing."
  - 1. thou sayest = lego to lay, to lay together; to collect, hence, to lay before, to relate, to collect words into an oration, much more than "think."
  - 2. rich = plousios to become rich.
  - 3. goods = plouteo to be rich in anything.
  - 4. nothing = oudeis not one thing, none at all; not even one thing.
  - 5. Does this church feel this way?
- B. "and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked."
  - 1. knowest = oida to perceive, or see.
  - wretched = talaiporos enduring toil and hardship, as from severe bodily effort; then the state arising from this, ragged, tattered, exhausted.
  - 3. miserable = eleeinos = pitiable, piteous, the object of pity that extends help.
  - poor = ptochos poor, extremely poor, poor as a beggar.
  - 5. blind = tuphlos In a city famous for its medical school and "Phyogian powder." [eye-salve.]
  - naked = gumnos = without clothing.

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- A. "I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich;"
  - 1. counsel = sumbouleuo to advise.
  - 2. buy of me = agorazo to be in the "agora" [market place] to attend it, to do business there.
  - 3. tried = puroo to burn, to refine.
  - 4. rich = plouteo to be rich, or wealthy.
- B. "and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and the shame of thy nakedness do not appear."
  - 1. shame = aischune dishonour, disgrace.
  - appear = phaneroo to make known.
- C. "and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see."
  - 1. anoint = egchrio to rub in.
  - eyesalve = The Phrygian powder was apparently applied to the eyes in the form of a doughy paste.
- V. THE REASON FOR GOD'S REBUKE AND CHASTENING.
  - A. "as many as I love I rebuke and chasten."
    - love = phileo = to be fond of to love.
    - rebuke = elegcho = to put to shame, to convince, refute; show to be wrong, to prove anything that was disputed or denied.
    - 3. chasten = paideuo to train and educate; to cause to suffer as a part of learning.

#### [to cause them to:]

- B. "be zealous therefore, and repent."
  - zealous = zeloo to make zealous towards.
  - repent = metanoeo to change ones mind and one's purpose.
  - 3. Heb. 2:6-11.

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- A. "behold, I stand at the door, and knock."
  - 1. stand = histemi to stand fast, stand still.
  - 2. knock = krouo to rap at a door for entrance.
- B. "If any man hear my voice and open the door."
  - 1. hear = diakouo to hear through, hear fully.
  - open = anoigo to open, to stand open.
- B. "I will come in unto him, and will sup with him, and he th me."
  - 1. come in = eiserchomai to come into.
  - sup = deipneo to take the chief meal.
  - God offers His fellowship to those still willing to hear the truth.

# VII. GOD'S PROMISE TO THE OVERCOMER. V21

- A. to him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne."
  - overcometh = nikon victor, victorious.
  - grant = didomi to give, present.
  - throne = throno a raised chair.
- B. "even as I also overcame and am sat down with my Father in His throne."
  - 1. How did Jesus overcome? With ease? Did God grant Him His throne for faith only?
  - 2. set down = dathizo to cause to sit.
  - 3. We may be overcomers if we will do His will on earth as Jesus did God's will on earth.
    - a. Matt. 19:27-29.

#### VIII. GOD'S PLEA TO BE HEARD. V22

A. "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches."
