# THE CHURCH IN SMYRNA REV. 2:8-11

#### Introduction:

- A. This church has no condemnatory message.
  - 1. The only one of the seven churches.
  - 2. Exhorted to continue faithful service.
- B. "and unto the angel of the church in Smyrna, write."
  - Smyrna = Greek form of the Hebrew word, "myrrh", a sweet fragrant spice used in connection with burials
  - angel = messenger or pastor.

## I. THE AUTHOR'S ASSURANCE. V86

- A. "These things saith the first and the last."
  - 1. Jesus identifies Himself.
- B. "which was dead, and is alive."
  - 1. Which being dead is alive.

## II. THE CHARACTER OF THE CHURCH. U9

- A. "I know thy works and tribulation, and poverty, (but thou art rich)."
  - works = ergon the result of labor.
  - tribulation = thlipsis pressure, trouble.
  - poverty = ptocheia begging poverty, extreme.
  - rich = plousios wealthy.
- B. "and I know the blasphemy of them which say they are Jews, and are not, but are the synagogue of satan."
  - 1. A literal settlement of Jews, brought fuel.
  - 2. Polycarp, pastor, burned in 156.

### III. THE CHURCH WOULD SUFFER. V10

#### page 23

- A. "fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer."
  - suffer = pascho to be acted upon by something from without.
  - 2. Jesus = Matt. 10:28.
- B. "behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that yemay be tried."
  - 1. Matt. 10:16-18.
  - 2. The servant is not above His master.
- C. "and ye shall have tribulation ten days."
  - 1. The ten following rulers is doubtful.
  - 2. A short period of time.
- D. "be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life."
  - Polycarp = "Eighty and six years have I served Christ, and He has done me nothing but good; How then could I curse Him, my Lord and Savior?"

#### IV. THE PROMISE OF GOD. V11

- A. "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches."
  - 1. Not literal ears but a discerning heart.
- B. "He that overcometh shall not be hurt of the second death."
  - 1. Rev. 20:14.
  - 2. All the lost and wicked.
