- I. THE SEALING OF A NATION. REV. 7:1-8.
 - A. The wrath of God falling on the earth was stayed for a special work of God.
 - i. Rev. 7:1-2.
 - 2. This is a time for God to use to "seal" 144,000 Jews
 - 3. seal = sphragizo to mark, to brand.
 - 4. 12,000 from each tribe.

II. THE POWER OF THE LAMB. V14:1

- A. "And I looked, and, lo, a lamb stood on the mount Sion and with him an hundred forty and four thousand having his Fathers name written in their forehead."
 - 1. Psalm 14:7, "Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! When the Lord bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad."
 - 2. Isa. 59:20, "And the redeemer shall come to Zion and unto them that turn from transgression in Jacob, saith the Lord."
 - 3. Heb. 8:8-12.
- B. The special circumstances of their deliverance from the beast.
 - v22, "voices and harps."
 - 2. v3, "no man could learn that song."

III. THE JEWS AND THEIR CHARACTER. V4

- A. "These are they which were not defiled with women, for they are virgins."
 - defiled = moluno to soil, to stain.
 - 2. virgins = parthenos virgin.
 - 3. Figuratively they have kept themselves pure from all defiling relationships, they have not received the mark of the beast nor had any relationships with Babylon, the great harlot.
- B. "These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth."
 - follow = akoloutheo to follow one, or to be with him, or after him, [from a footman].
- C. "These were redeemed from among men being the firstfruits unto God and to the Lamb."

- 1. redeemed = agorazo to buy, to purchase.
- 2. They were "extracted" from mankind.
- firstfruits = aparche They were the first of many
 Jews to be saved.
- D. "And in their mouth was found no quile."
 - found = heurisko to find out, discover.
 - guile = pseudos lie.
- E. "for they are without fault before the throne of God."
 - fault = amomos Without fault or blemish of sin, not spoiled by any flaw, [as in the Law of Moses].
 - 2. They are "spotless" before God.

 - 1. We have believed in Him.
 - 2. He has saved us.

 - 1. We do not have a visible mark.
