## I. THE BEAST'S ORIGIN AND CHARACTER. V11

- A. "And I beheld another beast coming up out of the earth."
  - 1. beast = therion wild beast, monster.
  - 2. earth = ge the earth, land.
- B. "and he had two horns like a lamb, and he speaks as a dragon."
  - two horns = keras horn.
  - 2. lamb = arnion.
  - 3. spake.
  - 4. dragon = drakon.

#### II. HIS POWER AND HIS PURPOSE. V12

A. "And he exercise thall the power of the first beast before him."

page 124

- exerciseth = execute, poieo to make, to bring about, to do, practice.
- 2. before him = enopion face to face, in his presence
- B. "and causeth the earth and them which dwell therein to worship the first beast, whose deadly wound was healed."
  - causeth = poieo to produce, to make, to be the means of a thing, continued action.
  - 2. dwell = katoikeo to dwell fixedly in a place, to settle down in a fixed dwelling.
- C. "And he doeth great wonders, so that he maketh fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men."
  - wonders = semeion = a sign or token by which anything is designated, distinguished, or known.
  - sight = henopion in the sight or presence of.

### III. HIS POWER TO DECEIVE THE MASSES. V14

- A. "And deceiveth them that dwell on the earth by means of those miracles which he had power to do in the sight of the beast."
  - deceiveth = planao to cause to err, to make to stray, to lead astray, religious deceit.
  - 2. miracles = semeion a sign, a signal.
  - power = eksousia permission.
- B. "Saying to them that dwell on the earth, that they should make an image to the beast which had the wound by a sword and did live."
  - saying = lego to lay together, to collect, to lay before, to relate, an oration.
    - a. Dan. 7:20, "And a mouth that spake very great things."
    - b. Rev. 13:5.
  - image = eikon that which resembles an object.
  - 3. wound = plege a stripe, a blow, then a wound caused by a blow or a strike. This is a point of continual repetition and emphasis.

- C. "And he has power to give life unto the image of the beast that the image of the beast should both speak and cause that as many as would not worship the image of the beast should be killed."
  - power = eksousia.
  - 2. life = pneuma = wind, breath breathed forth.
  - image = eikon image, likeness.
  - 4. speak = laleo to utter words, use the voice.
  - 5. cause = poleo to cause, to be the means of a thing
  - 6. II Thess. 2:7-12.
