THE SIN UNTO DEATH

I John 5:16-18

Introduction:

- A. There are two principles found here. vs. 16
 - 1. God's people sin.
 - 2. God's people should pray for sinning brothers.
- B. There are two categories of sin.
 - 1. "a sin which is not unto death."
 - 2. "a sin unto death."

I. THE SIN WHICH IS NOT UNTO DEATH

- A. We can see our brother sin.
 - "If any man see his brother sin a sin which is not unto death."
 - 2. What is sin?
 - a. Under the law. "sin is transgression of the law"
 - b. We are not under the law, therefore, "all unrighteousness is sin." vs. 17
- B. We are to aid a sinning brother.
 - "he shall ask, and he shall give him life for them that sin not unto death."
 - This probably refers to seeing a brother sin and then seeing the brother become ill.
 - "he shall give him life."
- C. Additional information from Jesus. James 5:13-20
 - affliction = to suffer evil.
 - merry = (eu) well, (thumes) soul.
 - sick = to be infirm, weak, feeble.
- D. This was the practice of churches when spiritual gifts were operative.

- 3. Korah and all that appertain. Numbers 16:
- 4. Moses. Deut. 3:23-26.
- 5. Annias and Sapphira.
- Corinthians. "Many are weak and sickly, and many sleep."
- 7. Judah. Jeremiah 7:16.

III. THOSE WHO ARE BORN AGAIN WILL BE KEPT BY THE POWER OF GOD. VS. 18

- A. "we know that whosoever is born of God sinneth not."
 - 1. I John 3:9.
 - 2. The spirit is born again, not the flesh.
- B. "but he that is begotten of God keepeth him."
 - 1. "but He who was born of God keeps him."RSV
 - 2. "for the Son of God will guard him."
 - 3. "but the Son who was born of God Keeps him."
 - 4. John 10:27-30.
- C. "and that wicked one toucheth him not."
 - toucheth = to lay hold of someone in order to harm them.
 - 2. Satan could not touch Job!
