- A. John saw a door opened in heaven. Chapter 4
 - 1. A voice bade him come up. v1
 - 2. He immediately went up. v2
- B. John saw God on His throne.
 - There were 4 "living ones" = beasts.
 - 2. There were 24 "elders."
- C. They all gave glory to and worshipped God as the creator.
 - v8,9 "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God."
 - v11, "Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory, honor and power; for thou hast created..."
- I. GOD HAD A BOOK IN HIS RIGHT HAND. VI
 - A. "And I saw in the right hand of him that sat on the throne a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals."
 - book -= biblion a paper, a letter, a roll.
 - sealed = kata sphragizo to seal down.
 - Seven seals, Seven witnesses, Roman law.
 - B. "Ezekiel saw a similiar book of judgment.
 - 1. Ezek. 2:9,10, [747 B.C.]
 - 2. "a roll of a book was written...within and without"
- II. WHO IS WORTHY TO OPEN THE BOOK? 2.3
 - A. "And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?"
 - strong = ischuros physically strong, mighty.

- proclaiming = Kerusso announce publicly.
- loud = megas great in force and intensity.
- 4. worthy aksios of equal value.
- B. "And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon."
 - 1. no man in heaven.
 - 2. no man in earth.
 - no man under the earth.
 a. under = hupokato down under, underneath.
 - 4. able =dunatos having inherent moral power, capable of doing, strong.
- 5. No one was able to even look on it! [WHERE ARE THE POPES, SAINTS, EVANGELISTS, FAKERS, FRAUDS?]
 - IV. THE BITTER DISAPPOINTMENT OF JOHN. V4
 - A. "And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and to read the book, neither to look thereon."
 - 1. wept much = elaio to cry, to weep aloud.
 - 2. found = heurisko to discover with search.
 - 3. Will this end all. John had suffered many disappointments.
 - B. Why is this book important?
 - 1. It is the book of redeemption, complete.
 - 2. It is the book of judgment, the final righting of all wrings! in heaven and on the earth.
- IV. THE ONE WHO IS WORTHY. V5,6
 - A. "And one of the elders saith unto me, weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof."
 - 1. The Lion sprung from Judah.

- 2. The foundation of Davidic hopes.
- "He hath prevailed." = enimesen = nikao. To win a victory, to be a victor, to overcome.
- 4. loose = luo to unbind.
- B. "And I beheld, and lo, in the midst of the throne and of the beasts, and in the midst of the elders."
 - 1. throne, beasts, elders.
 - midst = mess middle.
- C. "stood a lamb as it had been slain."
 - stood = istemi to stand, standfast.
 - 2. lamb = arnios a pet lamb, gentle.
 - slain =- sphazo to slaughter, to slay.
- D. "having seven horns, and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent forth into all the earth."
 - horns = keras a horn of a beast, power.
 - eyes = ophthalmos the eye.
 - 3. The seven spirits.
 - 4. Isaiah 11:1-3. [640 B.C.]

V. THE BOOK TAKEN FROM THE FATHER. V7

- A. "and he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat on the throne."
 - 1. The greatest act of the ages!
 - took = lambano to take with the hands.
 - 3. He is the "Goel", the only mediator.
- B. This is the beginning of the end.
 - 1. The world will be subdued.
 - 2. The second Adam begins his reign.
 - 3. Rev. 6:1-2.
